message from The chief

2022 was a year of recovery.

The community and the library got back on their feet after pandemic restrictions were lifted. This was not a quick or simple process; there were many stresses to recover from, memories of how things used to work were sometimes spotty, and new approaches were often necessary to meet new circumstances.

The social and psychological effects of the pandemic lingered a long time but they are receding in 2023. Our services have returned to new normal levels, and community demand has steadily increased to the point where library spaces and programs are packed with happy customers. Staff morale seems good and we are enjoying ourselves again. We hope that community members are feeling positive as well.



We are experiencing "good problems" in 2023. Most of our programs fill up before we can even publicize them. We can't meet the demand for meeting room rentals. Free library card sponsorships that used to last a month are now used up in a couple of weeks. We are happy the community values our services but we need to do more to meet the demand. This is hard with limited resources but we will do our best, for example with expanded meeting room hours and passive programming that takes less staff time to deliver.

We are experiencing some more difficult challenges as well. Social disorder in the community and our facility has increased. Safety and visitor well being are our top priorities in 2023. We have put together a working group of staff, managers and Board members to develop a comprehensive safety plan. We are piloting new safety initiatives, trying new staffing arrangements and fine tuning our facilities to improve actual and perceived safety.

It will take money and other resources but we must do everything possible to make our library safe and pleasant for visitors and staff.

The City of Medicine Hat Library Board governs the Medicine Hat Public Library and the delivery of library services to the community. It is responsible for communicating with funders and the community, aligning Library services with community needs, and managing Library operations on a governance level. Board members are appointed by City Council as required. The Board has a monthly public meeting (except in summer) and Board committees typically meet monthly as well. Board vacancies are normally advertised in the fall on the City's website.

Community members are encouraged to apply.






